- David Brenner (7/5/75) has two warrants for probation violations.
- Ellery Charging Thunder (2/20/54) has been found mentally incompetent to stand trial and all of his pending misdemeanor cases have automatically been dismissed per State law. His geographic restriction from the area is now void.
- William Ernst (11/22/65) will complete his sentence for 4th degree assault of hospital personnel and be released from prison on 12/10.
- Brian Whitebird (12/8/68) has a misdemeanor warrant for trespassing.

- Robbery of person: 11/2, 4 a.m., near 19th & 1st. A victim was walking home from a bar and a suspect came up from behind, pushed him to the ground, and took his wallet including cash and a bank card. The victim was transported to a hospital.
- Robbery of person: 11/24, 12:40 p.m., in 1921 1st Ave. A suspect took a victim's wallet with cash, i.d., and bank cards. The suspect is known to the victim.
- Robbery of person: 11/26, 6:15 a.m., at 1828 Clinton Ave. A resident of a unit in this condo building went out the back sliding door to let his dog out. When the resident returned, he found a suspect inside with a gun. The suspect demanded money at gunpoint. The suspect left with the person's bank card and cell phone.
- Robbery of business: 11/18, 6:40 p.m., Third Avenue Market, 1905 3rd Ave. A suspect wearing a mask pointed a gun at the clerk. The clerk ran to the back of the store. A book was stolen. - Aggravated assault: 11/3, 7:30 p.m., at Franklin & Nicollet. A person was arrested for a stabbing that took place near CVS.
- Burglary: 11/3, 1 p.m., at 1805 1st Ave. A suspect, who is known to the victim, took prescription pills, electronics, and jewelry.
- Motor vehicle theft: 11/4 at Franklin & 3rd. A spare key was inside the vehicle.

Alcohol-related offenses include consuming alcohol in public, open bottle, and possession of liquor in a park.

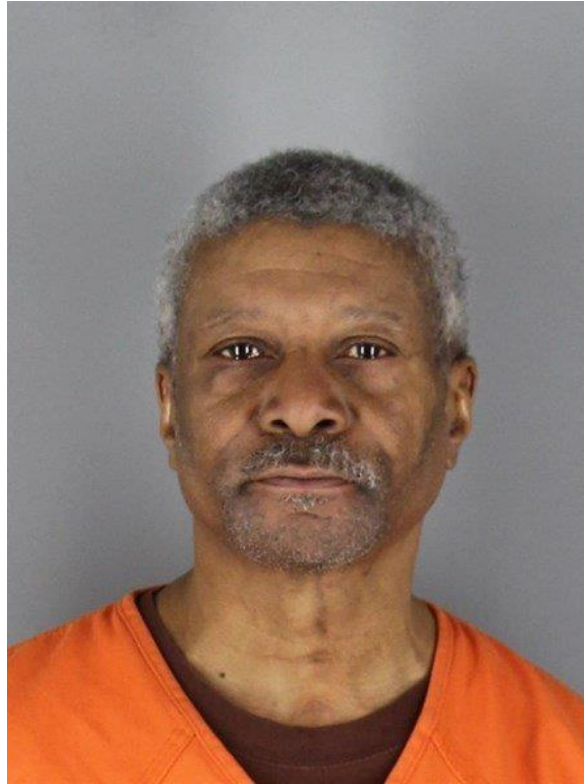
Narcotics-related offenses include narcotics violation, loitering with intent to buy or sell narcotics, and possession of drug paraphernalia.

Robert Lee Johnson (7/9/58) 23 prior convictions in Hennepin and Ramsey Counties since 1999 for disorderly conduct (4), loitering with intent to commit a crime, being in a closed park, 2nd degree assault with a dangerous weapon (3), attempted 2nd degree assault with a dangerous weapon, 5th degree assault (3), trespassing (3), consuming alcohol in public, criminal damage to property, open bottle, driving while intoxicated, interfering with the operator of a transit vehicle, 4th degree felony assault of a police officer, and riding public transit without paying the fare.

Case 10/3/16, terroristic threats and felony 5th degree assault at 2001 Nicollet Ave. (16-359635)

Outcome On 9/1/17, pled guilty to terroristic threats; the 5th degree assault charge was dismissed. Sentenced on 10/24/17: 33 months in prison, stayed for three years. Dispositional departure by the judge: stay of execution. Serve 365 days, with credit for 247 days served which satisfies the 365-day sentence per the judge. Conditions of release: supervised probation; follow all state and federal laws; stay away from a three-block radius of CVS, 2001 Nicollet Ave; no use of alcohol or controlled substances; anger management; chemical dependency assessment and treatment; mental health evaluation. Pay \$78 court fees.

Ned Devon McDonald (11/24/61) 16 arrests in the area since 2006. 25 prior convictions in Hennepin County since 1989 for theft, 4th degree criminal sexual conduct, 2nd degree criminal sexual conduct, failure to notify authorities of changes in predatory offender registration, aggressive panhandling, consuming alcohol in public (6), open bottle (3), trespassing (7), theft (2), check forgery, and failure to register as a predatory offender.

Case 7/26/17, open bottle at 2110 Nicollet Ave, cited by Franklin Nicollet beat officers. (17-281062)

Outcome On 11/7/17, this case was dismissed. Pled guilty to trespassing from 8/24/17. Stay of imposition. Conditions of release: supervised probation for one year; no same or similar offenses; remain law abiding; comply with HOMES Court recommendations. \$153 court fees waived.

Lamar Lee Jones (4/16/78) 7 prior convictions in Hennepin County for 2nd degree felony possession of a controlled substance, domestic assault, resisting / interfering with arrest, riding public transit without paying the fare, driving while intoxicated (2), and disorderly conduct.

Case 10/7/17, public urination at 19th & Nicollet, cited by squad 513. (17-387136)

Outcome On 10/27/17, this case was dismissed. Pled guilty to 5th degree assault from 6/30/17; an additional 5th degree assault charge and a disorderly conduct charge were dismissed. Sentence: 90 days, 86 days stayed for one year, serve 4 days, with credit for 4 days served. Conditions of release: probation to the court; no assault; no contact with victim(s); pay restitution; do not commit any new crime. \$75 court fees waived. Pay additional \$78 court fees.
