### Part 1 crimes reported in Stevens Square-Loring Heights, April 24 to May 28, 2015 (source: Crime Prevention Specialist Chelsea Adams)

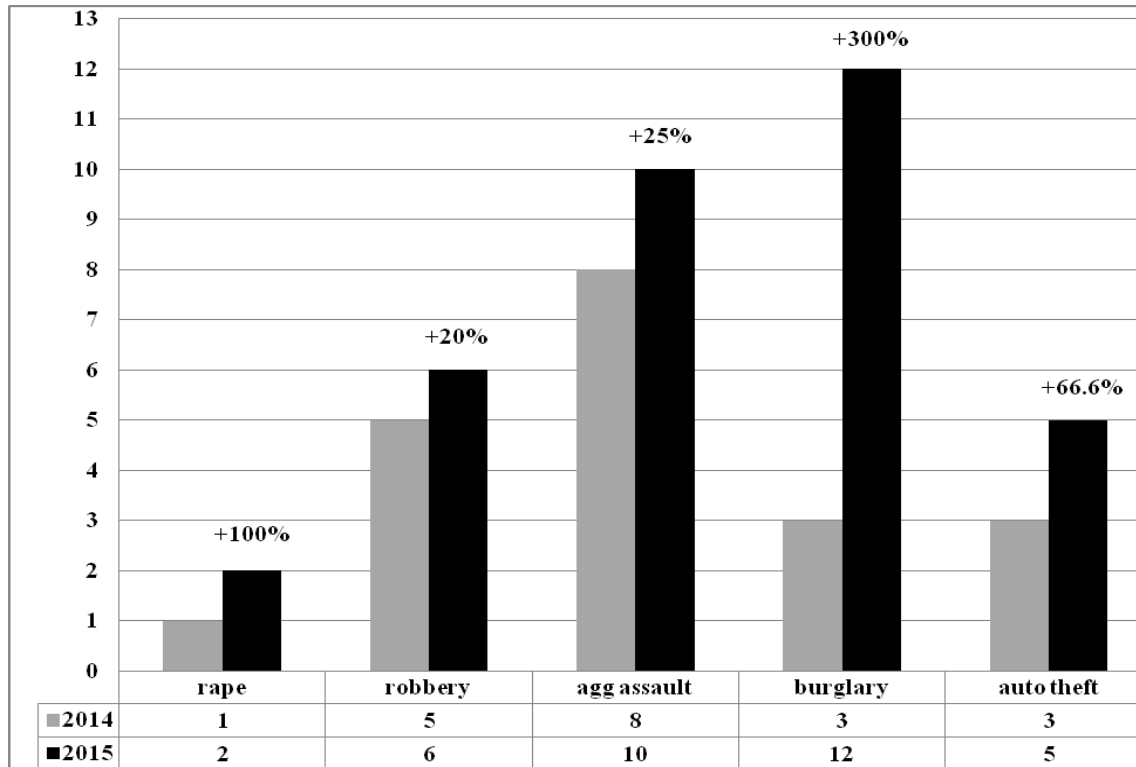
- No sexual assaults.
- No robberies.
- No motor vehicle thefts.
- 3 aggravated assaults: 4/28, 9:50 p.m., at Franklin & 3<sup>rd</sup> in which Anthony Deangelo Jackson (7/19/81) was arrested for assaulting four police officers following a traffic stop for speeding after which he fled on foot; 4/28, 11:40 p.m., at 1827 LaSalle Ave in which Mohamed Ibrahim Aden (5/3/62) was arrested for assaulting a female victim who is known to him; 5/22, 7:25 p.m., at 17<sup>th</sup> & 1<sup>st</sup> in which shots were fired, damaging a parked vehicle but causing no injuries – anyone with suspect or other investigatory information for this case (CCN 15-184818) should call the Violent Crimes Investigation Division at (612) 673-2941.
- 7 burglaries: 4/28 at 1707 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave in which a suspect failed to force entry to an apartment; 4/29 at 137 East 17<sup>th</sup> St in which keys taken from lock boxes in the entryway of this apartment building were used to access the laundry room and storage area; 5/1 at 1901 Stevens in which storage units were broken into; 4/29 to 5/2 at 1800 Stevens Ave in which a suspect failed to force entry to an apartment; 5/11 to 5/13 at 214 East 19<sup>th</sup> St in which Rahsaan Migel Wells (3/19/76) was subsequently arrested and charged for burglarizing the laundry room; 5/15 at 1721 3<sup>rd</sup> Ave in which a tenant's key fob was used to burglarize a laundry room; 5/21 at 229 Ridgewood Ave in which a known suspect stole a resident's keys and gained entry to an apartment.
- 3 bike thefts, all involving locks or chains being cut: 5/10 at 1826 LaSalle Ave; 5/2 to 5/15 at 18<sup>th</sup> & 1<sup>st</sup>; 5/17 at 1920 4<sup>th</sup> Ave.
- 2 thefts from motor vehicles: 4/24 at 344 East 19<sup>th</sup> St in which an unknown suspect gained entry through a partially open window and took a laptop computer and other items; 4/27 at Franklin & 1<sup>st</sup> in which a witness saw a suspect break a window and take something from inside.
- 7 other incidents of theft, including 5/24 at 217 Ridgewood Ave in which a suspect entered an apartment through an unlocked door, distracted the resident with a story about needing to call someone for assistance, and took the resident's wallet. A female accomplice was waiting in the hallway and the resident's credit cards were used almost immediately after they left the building.

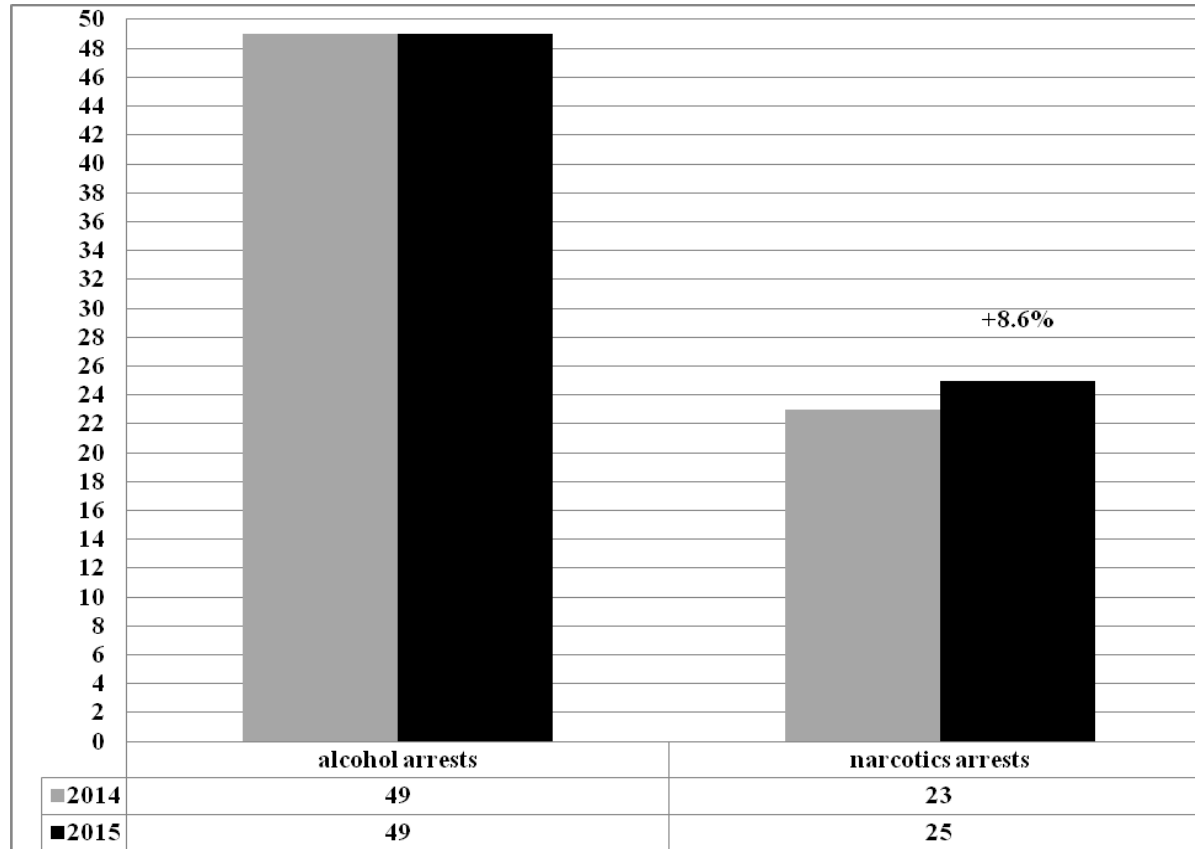

Alcohol-related offenses include consuming alcohol in public, open bottle, and possession of liquor in a park. Narcotics-related offenses include narcotics violation, loitering with intent to buy or sell narcotics, and possession of drug paraphernalia. Prostitution-related offenses include prostitution, loitering with intent to commit prostitution.

**CLEAN list update, April 24 to May 28, 2015** (source: Community Attorney Nikki Appelbaum)

- [Patrick Addy](#) – on supervised probation for gross misdemeanor trespassing, set for court on 6/9 for disorderly conduct, charges pending for new assault (of a deputy at the jail) and open bottle cases.
- [Ellery Charging Thunder](#) – on supervised probation for trespassing, set for court on 5/29 for consuming alcohol in public and on 6/12 for trespassing, prosecutor pushing for in-patient treatment.
- [Harry Leftbear](#) – on probation for gross misdemeanor trespassing and felony 4<sup>th</sup> degree assault, set for court on 6/1 for consuming alcohol in public, loitering, and trespassing, set for court on 6/12 for trespassing.
- [Ahmed Hired](#) – on probation for open bottle and trespassing, active warrant for failing to appear in court on an open bottle case.
- [Robert Yellow Wolf](#) – added back to the list due to new offenses, set for court on 6/18 for open bottle (3), consuming alcohol in public (2), and gross misdemeanor trespassing (2); will complete his sentence for 3<sup>rd</sup> degree assault in Anoka County on 7/25 which means that, with credit for time served, he will serve no additional time for the remaining cases above; he will be considered for geographic restrictions on any new cases.
