

## SSCO Community Safety information sheet, June 25, 2015

### Part 1 crimes reported in Stevens Square-Loring Heights, May 29 to June 25, 2015 (source: Crime Prevention Specialist Chelsea Adams)

- No sexual assaults.
- No aggravated assaults.
- No motor vehicle thefts.
- 2 robberies: 5/29, 7 p.m., at 1812 Nicollet Ave in which a suspect – who may be known to the victim – punched a person in the face and stole his cell phone; 6/15, 3:30 p.m., at Franklin & 3<sup>rd</sup> in which a suspect – who is known to the victim – threatened a person with a hard, sharp object and took his phone.
- 2 apartment burglaries: 6/2 to 6/3 at 1817 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave with no sign of forced entry; 6/9 to 6/10 at 229 Ridgewood Ave while the resident was asleep in the bedroom and with no sign of forced entry.

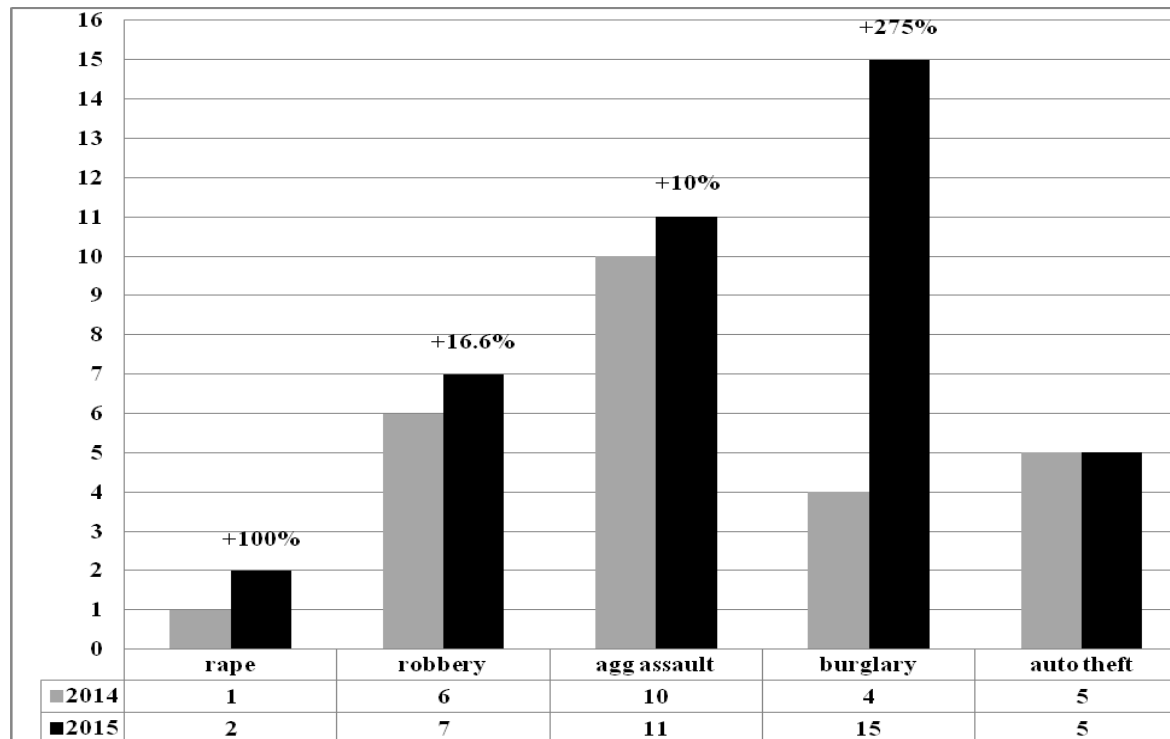
- [Lavell Love](#) – on supervised probation for gross misdemeanor trespassing, restricted from the area as a condition of release, ten months since he was arrested for any crime, staying sober, healthy, acquired a full-time job, obtained housing, getting a driver's license.
- [Nathaniel Roby](#) – on supervised probation for gross misdemeanor indecent exposure, restricted from the area as a condition of release, 5 p.m. to 6 a.m. curfew, in Homes court, getting healthy, staying sober, acquired housing.
- [David Omurwa](#) – added to the list, a history of aggressive, inappropriate behavior toward females, in custody on \$300 bail, set for court on 6/25 for 5<sup>th</sup> degree assault, open bottle, disorderly conduct (2), and trespassing, restricted from the area as a pre-trial condition of release.

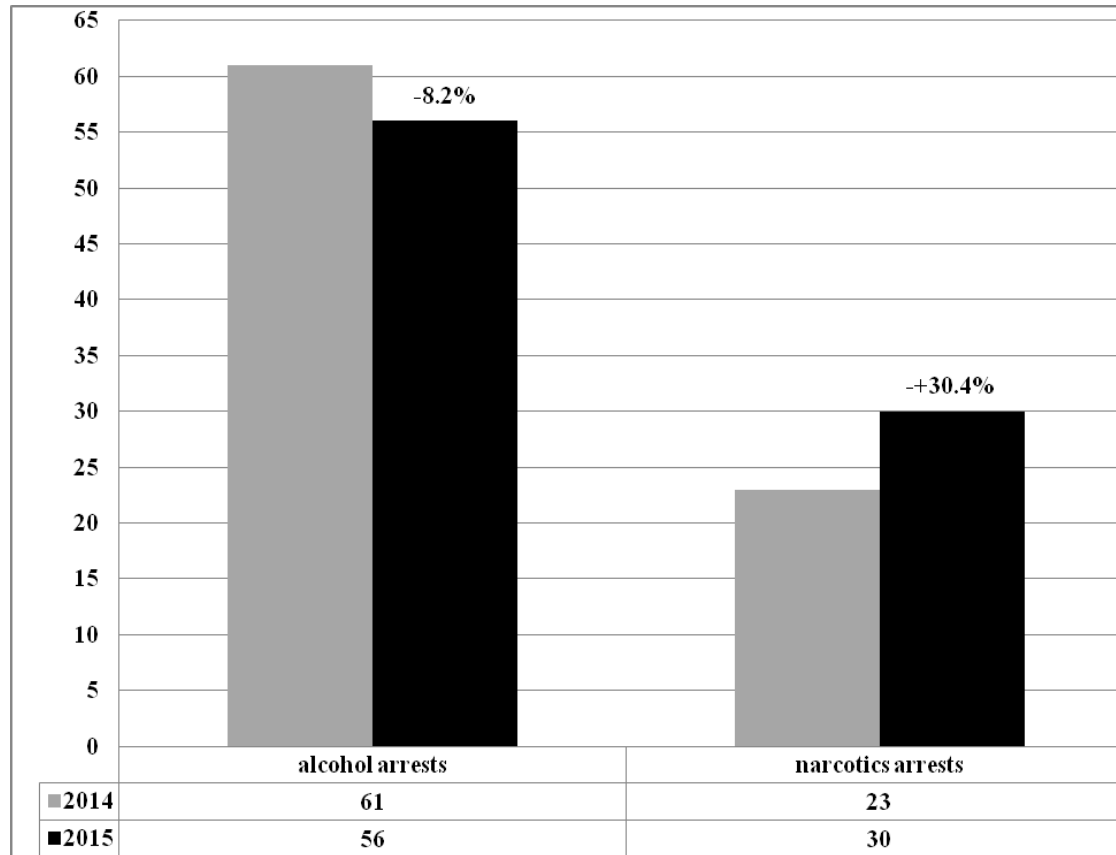

Alcohol-related offenses include consuming alcohol in public, open bottle, and possession of liquor in a park. Narcotics-related offenses include narcotics violation, loitering with intent to buy or sell narcotics, and possession of drug paraphernalia. Prostitution-related offenses include prostitution, loitering with intent to commit prostitution.

**Robert Raymond Gagnon** (a.k.a. Eldard, 4/30/68) 41 prior convictions in Minnesota since 1987 for attempted motor vehicle theft, 5<sup>th</sup> degree assault (3), receiving stolen property, criminal damage to property (2), 1<sup>st</sup> degree burglary (3), 3<sup>rd</sup> degree burglary (2), attempted 3<sup>rd</sup> degree burglary, 4<sup>th</sup> degree felony possession of a controlled substance, disorderly conduct (4), theft (10), attempted theft, obstructing the legal process, domestic assault, harassment, open bottle, possession of burglary or theft tools, attempted robbery, consuming alcohol in public, interference with a transit operator, criminal contempt of court, trespassing, tampering with a motor vehicle, and public nuisance.

**Case** 1/2/15, terroristic threats at Vanilla Gorilla Tattoo, 4 East Franklin Ave, arrested by day beat officers. (15-001734)

**Outcome** On 3/27/15, pled guilty. On 4/23/15, pled guilty to 1<sup>st</sup> degree burglary of dwelling from 3/29/15. On 6/2/15, the defendant was sentenced to 24 months in prison for each case, with the sentences ordered to be served concurrently. With credit for time served (81 days on the first case, 66 days on the second), the defendant is expected to be released from prison on 7/27/16.

**Sentencing judge** – Hillary Caligiuri

**Deanna Lynn Smith** (1/5/74) 10 arrests in the area in the past eight years. 26 prior convictions in Hennepin and Anoka Counties for disorderly conduct (2), theft (4), open bottle (4), 5<sup>th</sup> degree assault (2), aggressive panhandling, trespassing (10), interfering with traffic, riding public transit without paying the fare, and 3<sup>rd</sup> degree assault causing significant bodily harm.

**Case** 3/11/15, consuming alcohol in public in Stevens Square Park, 1801 Stevens Ave, cited by Park police. (15-083225)

**Outcome** Convicted on 5/6/15. Case continued in Homes Court. Conditions of release: probation to the court for one year; comply with Homes Court.

**Sentencing judge** – Bruce Peterson

**Larry Charles Townsend** (6/20/52) 3 arrests in the area in the past seven months. 63 prior convictions in Minnesota for 5<sup>th</sup> degree criminal sexual conduct (2), disorderly conduct (19), trespassing (13), theft (3), domestic assault (3), 5<sup>th</sup> degree assault (3), obstructing the legal process (2), loitering with unlawful intent, 4<sup>th</sup> degree assault of a police officer, escape from custody, giving police false information, 5<sup>th</sup> degree felony sale of marijuana, indecent conduct, violating a no contact order, terroristic threats, public urination, possession of a small amount of marijuana, interfering with traffic, consuming alcohol in public (3), loitering with intent to solicit, open bottle (2), and aggressive panhandling.

**Case** 5/21/15, disorderly conduct at Loring Nicollet Alternative School, 1925 Nicollet Ave, cited by day beat officers. (15-182642)

**Outcome** On 6/4/15, this case was dismissed along with a fleeing police case from 3/29/15. Pled guilty to open bottle from 4/17/15. Sentence: 7 days, with credit for 7 days served. Pled guilty to gross misdemeanor trespassing from 4/29/15. Sentence: 365 days, 275 days stayed for two years, serve 90 days. Report to the workhouse on 6/11/15. Conditions of release: supervised probation; no same or similar offenses; chemical dependency evaluation / treatment; no use of alcohol or controlled substances; no non-prescription drugs; stay a reasonable distance away from the victim's residence. \$50 fine stayed until 6/4/17. \$75 court fees waived. Pay additional \$78 court fees. Failed to report to the workhouse on 6/11; warrant issued. Arrested for the warrant on 6/15; sent to the workhouse on 6/17. Workhouse release: 8/13/15.
